There's a lot of internal courses, like, for programmes such as Excel or kind of even minute taking, like things like that, which are really good so that you actually know how to do those kind of things properly.

And then there's also kind of, for me, I'm on a joint Supervision team with the European Central Bank, so I do a lot of trainings with them as well.

So it's kind of moreso training focussed on Supervision and like kind of learning about ECB guidelines and things like that as well. So that is really good.

There's the One Bank certificate programme that all the graduates do together, which again is really nice because you get to spend more time with the grads.

And then yeah, we've completed the first module of that this year and it's really full, so you kind of got to hear and get a really good understanding for what central banking is as a whole and then how it works within Central Bank of Ireland as well.

I'm having a look at doing a Master's now as well.

So you go through the APS programme and you can apply for a Master's, which the Bank would fund for you as well.

And I think you're very - it's very flexible in what you can do as long as it's somewhat related to your work.

And in terms of going to lectures as well, like, they will be flexible for you going to lectures and then taking that time off to study and do exams.
